

1.1.General

Unless otherwise specified, the following are required:

- a) The scope shall be for the manufacture and delivery of vented lead acid cells to Solplaatje Municipality
 - i) flat plate (Fauré X) single cells only (2 V nominal)
 - ii) Supply of Recombination caps to fit on Vented Lead Acid cells
- b) All cells shall be supplied complete with all necessary inter-cell connectors, nuts, bolts, washers, anti-corrosion lubricant, cell numbers.
- c) The supplier shall also be responsible for the provision of maintenance equipment, safety equipment, battery stands, terminating devices and inter-row connectors, transport and disposal of used cells.

ELECTRICAL PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS**General**

The essential characteristic of a stationary cell or battery is its capacity for the storage of electric energy. This capacity, expressed in ampere-hours (Ah), varies depending on the conditions of use, which means that it is affected by the discharge rate, temperature and end-of-discharge voltage.

Rated Capacity

The rated capacities shall be specified at a reference temperature of 20°C, over a discharge period of 10h to a final end-of-discharge voltage of 1,80V/cell.

The required battery capacities shall be specified.

- i) **125 Ah**
- ii) **167 Ah**
- iii) **209 Ah**
- iv) **250 Ah**

Discharge curves and tables

The manufacturer shall submit discharge curves and / or tables that indicate the discharge performance for offered cells at a reference temperature of 20°C, to the end-of-discharge voltages of 1,6V/cell, and 1,8V/cell and 1,85V/cell, over the following discharge periods:

5 min, 10 min, 10 min, 20 min, 40min, 50 Min, 1 hr, 2 hr, 3 hr, 4 hr, 5hr, 6 hr, 7 hr, 8 hr, 9hr, and 10 hr

Endurance

The expected life of the cell or battery shall be 20 years under ideal conditions as per manufacturer specification

The expected end-of-life capacity shall be not less than $0,8C_{10}$

The manufacturer shall state the expected rate of deterioration

Short-circuit current and internal resistance

The manufacturer shall state the value of the short-circuit current, I_{sc} .

The manufacturer shall state the value of the internal resistance, R_i , at the reference temperature of 20 °C and at the values of SG and voltage for a fully charged cell.

Effect of temperature

The manufacturer shall indicate, i, the effects of temperature on the expected battery life.

MECHANICAL REQUIREMENTS

General

The offered cells shall be of the vented type in which the electrolyte is diluted sulphuric acid. The cells shall be fitted with plates in which the active materials on the positive and negative electrodes are lead dioxide (PbO_2) and spongy lead (Pb) respectively.

The stationary cells shall be designed to withstand mechanical stresses during normal transportation and handling.

Plates

The positive plates shall be of the pasted, open-grid type for the flat plate cells, The negative plates shall be of the pasted open-grid type. The grid shall be made of lead alloys with low water loss characteristics.

The plates shall be designed to minimise sedimentation, loss of active material, distortion and buckling.

Seperators

Separators shall be made of a micro porous material which is chemically inert and offers minimal internal resistance.

The life of the separators shall be at least equal to the life of the plates.

Terminal Posts

The terminal posts shall not be exposed after installation, this is to prevent accidental short circuit.

The terminal posts shall be designed to give minimum resistance and provide maximum current flow.

The terminal posts shall be compatible with the electrochemical conditions within the cell and shall be suitable for mechanical connections. The manufacturer shall state the recommended torque levels for the connections.

The terminal posts shall not carry any part of the weight of either plate group.

Terminal seals

The terminal seals shall fit firmly around the screw terminal posts to prevent any form of electrolyte creepage or leakage between the terminal post and the cell lid. The seal shall thus be designed to prevent corrosion of the terminal post above the cell lid.

Containers

The containers shall be made of a plastics material which is translucent and free from bubbles.

The minimum and maximum levels shall be indicated on the container wall.

When resting on a level surface, the containers shall stand firmly and their top surfaces shall be horizontal.

Cell lids

The cell lids shall be sealed to the container.

The complete cell shall be sufficiently sealed to handle the internal pressure during normal operation.

Vent plugs

The filler / vent plugs shall be readily removable, and so located to permit the easy topping-up of cells, where applicable.

The plugs shall be designed so that the free escape of gases from the cells is permitted, but also that electrolyte spray is trapped and returned to the cells.

The cell vent plug should be compatible to be used with recombination systems

Gas recombination units

The manufacturer should state the hydrogen and oxygen gas recombination for his product, and supply brochure and track record

The manufacturer should indicate the life expectancy of the catalyst inside the gas recombination unit.

Containment of shredded active material

The cell shall be designed to ensure that sufficient space is allowed for below the plate ends, at the bottom of the cell container, for the safe containment (e.g. not causing short circuits) of shredded active material during the life of the cell.

Positive plate growth

The cells shall be designed in such a way that the expansion of positive plates, due to positive plate growth over the lifetime of the cell, shall not cause the cell lids to lift or crack.

Inter Cell Connectors:

The inter-cell connectors shall be of fully insulated type with perfect seal capabilities

Cell orientation

Face-to-face, i.e. with the face of the outer plates of each cell facing directly against the face of the outer plates of adjacent cells.

Cell marking and labelling

The minimum and maximum levels shall be clearly indicated on the container wall.

The following information shall be clearly and permanently marked on each cell:

- i) the manufacturer's or supplier's name,
- ii) type code,
- iii) date of manufacture (month and year),
- iv) voltage,
- v) C_{10} capacity at the reference temperature,
- vi) reference temperature
- vii) the SG for a fully charged cell at the reference temperature

Information relevant to safety recommendations as required by local, national or international regulations shall be marked on each cell.

Each cell shall have a label indicating the number of the cell. These numbers shall run consecutively, commencing with the most positive cell as number one.

Battery water

The manufacturer shall state, in schedule B, the maximum conductivity of the recommended battery water to be used for topping-up purposes.

Accessories

Bolts, nuts, washers and connectors:

Cells shall be supplied complete with all required inter-cell connectors, nuts, bolts and washers (including flat and spring washers).

The material used for the bolts, nuts and washers shall be suitable for the application and ensure a reliable connection for the life of the equipment.

The bolts, nuts and washers shall be suitable for the connections and shall not deform or shear under the recommended torque levels.

Inter-cell connectors shall be of fully insulated bus bar type, to prevent any harmful shock to humans and short circuits.

Maintenance equipment

The following maintenance equipment, shall be made available:

- i) Jug,
- ii) Funnel,
- iii) Top-up bottle,
- iv) Anti-corrosion lubricant,
- v) Thermometer and
- vi) Hydrometer.

Personal protective equipment

The following personal protective equipment shall be made available:

- i) Apron,
- ii) Face shield, and
- iii) Gloves

Battery stands

Battery stands shall be supplied and will be manufactured with Laminated Pine.

Safety signs

The manufacturer shall make safety signs available.

Equipment performance

The manufacturer shall submit a full track record which shall include the following:

- i) Number of years that offered equipment has been in service;
- ii) Customers, indicating units employed, and their contact information;

Test certificates, drawings and instruction manuals

When called for in schedule A, copies of test certificates shall be submitted with tender documentation.

The manufacturer shall include a table with the following parameters for the cells:

- i) Cell type,
- ii) C₅ rated capacity [Ah],
- iii) Amount of electrolyte at maximum mark [litres],
- iv) Dry weight mass [kg],
- v) Wet weight mass [kg], and
- vi) Cell dimensions (length, width, height) [mm].

SPECIAL CONDITIONS:

1. The following documents shall be supplied with each battery consignment:

- i) A technical manual, which covers installation, commissioning, maintenance and safety instructions.
- ii) Commissioning test results, in the case of wet charged cells.

2. Warranty requirements

The manufacturer will be expected to provide a warranty of at least 2 years on flat plate designs.

The warranty offered shall be a warranty endorsed by the manufacturer and not the manufacturer's representative.

- 2. Proof of previous supply must be included.
- 3. Only commissioned wet charged cells must be delivered.

- (e) **“Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act”** means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003) as amended by Act No 46 of 2013;
- (f) **“comparative price”** means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can be utilized have been taken into consideration;
- (g) **“consortium or joint venture”** means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- (h) **“contract”** means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by an organ of state;
- (i) **“EME”** means an Exempted Micro Enterprise as defines by Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- (j) **“Firm price”** means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs or excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- (k) **“functionality”** means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- (l) **“non-firm prices”** means all prices other than “firm” prices;
- (m) **“person”** includes a juristic person;
- (n) **“QSE”** means a Qualifying Small Enterprise as defines by Codes of Good Practice issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- (o) **“rand value”** means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;

- (p) **“sub-contract”** means the primary contractor’s assigning, leasing, making out work to, or employing, another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- (q) **“total revenue”** bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act and promulgated in the *Government Gazette* on 9 February 2007;
- (r) **“trust”** means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and
- (s) **“trustee”** means any person, including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in order for such property to be administered for the benefit of another person.

3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 3.1 The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract.
- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts.
- 3.3 Points scored must be rounded off to the nearest 2 decimal places.
- 3.4 In the event that two or more bids have scored equal total points, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

4.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 is allocated for price on the following basis:

80/20

- 5.2 A bidder who qualifies as an EME in terms of the B-BBEE Act must submit a sworn affidavit confirming Annual Total Revenue and Level of Black Ownership.
- 5.3 A Bidder other than EME or QSE must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 5.4 A trust, consortium or joint venture, will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.
- 5.5 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- 5.6 Tertiary Institutions and Public Entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- 5.7 A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended sub-contractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
- 5.8 A person awarded a contract may not sub-contract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is sub-contracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
