CURRENT SITUATION

All Sol Plaatje Municipality Outdoor Advertising portfolio contracts have lapsed and are on a month to month. Sol Plaatje Municipality has recently developed an Outdoor Advertising Strategy to aggressively commercialize its outdoor advertising portfolio to explore the revenue generating opportunities by maximizing the return on its property portfolio. Sol Plaatje Municipality strategic objective is to manage the outdoor advertising portfolio by aligning it with stakeholders or business partners' growth in the industry.

PURPOSE / OBJECTIVE

The ultimate goal is for Sol Plaatje Municipality to position its self to recapitalise and commercialise every possible land and properties strategic for Outdoor advertising

BACKGROUND

The purpose of this web quote is to regulate and control Outdoor Advertising in the Sol Plaatje Municipality (SPM), and to provide opportunities for the outdoor advertising industry and local businesses to advertise in a controlled and structured way, throughout the SPM area.

Service providers in outdoor advertising are invited to submit request for proposal for managing, conduct a study/survey, and determine the capacity of outdoor advertising in SPM.

Understanding and implementation of SPM Outdoor Advertising By-Laws (2011) is crucial for this exercise. When service providers in the advertising industry acquires a space from Sol Plaatje Municipality, it is important that municipality should receive just compensation which is measured by determining "fair market value" based on a bona fide appraisal of the economic value of the property interest that is being availed for advertising.

The purpose of this outdoor advertising tender is to control any means of act or process of notifying, warning, informing or making known or any other act of transferring information in a visual manner, primarily to attract the attention of road users by means of any sign, model, placard, board, notice, billboard, poster, flag, banner, light display, device, structure, or representation employed outdoor wholly or partially.

The vision and mission of the SPM through outdoor advertising includes the following broad objectives:

- To create sustainable opportunities to assist with the development of the economic growth of the area and develop as a Diamond City;
- To generate income for the Council and provide opportunities for the local people, local businesses and the industry to advertise, in such a way that it will fight poverty and unemployment;
- To control and manage outdoor advertising in a structured way throughout the Municipal area, and through that to provide sustainable, affordable manner of services rendered for the public;
- To actively involve the community in the control and opportunities of outdoor advertising through local, accountable democracy through active community participation and involvement;
- To achieve all of this, while still taking special care of the environment, special countryside features, the culture of the area, as well as the nature and tourist attractions of the area, and through this also ensure a balance between safe human settlements and economic base of the Municipality.
- The municipality has the following sub categories in place:
 1. Billboards
 2. Permanent Lamp Post
 3. Illuminated Street Signs
 4. Suburban Signs
 5. Litter Bins
 6. Trailers
 7. Internal advertising within municipal buildings
 8. Moveable street advertisement
 9. Information signs

Sol Plaatje Municipality's Outdoor Advertising portfolio mainly consists of both illuminated and non-illuminated advertising space. The Billboard lease portfolio is spread throughout the Sol Plaatje Municipality.

The portfolio is leased to major reputable billboards companies in South Africa as well as few regionally based billboards companies operating on a small scale but with prospects to other regions. The portfolio has been managed as part of the broader leasing portfolio and not enough focus had been given to the portfolio to capitalize

on the opportunities within the Outdoor advertising market. This lack of focus has seen the portfolio losing value versus gain value because of lack of proactive marketing of the available space.

Maintaining the current billboard inventory and exploring new advertising mediums without measures to improve and align with the dynamic industry could see Sol Plaatje Municipality missing on further growth financially.

Sol Plaatje Municipality's intent is to appoint an outdoor media management company to assist in drawing up Terms of Reference with it in exploring further possible opportunities in outdoor advertising as well as maximising revenue potential.

- (s) “**trustee**” means any person, including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in order for such property to be administered for the benefit of another person.

3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

Updated 14/09/2017

- 3.1 The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract.
- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts;.
- 3.3 Points scored must be rounded off to the nearest 2 decimal places.
- 3.4 In the event that two or more bids have scored equal total points, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

4.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 is allocated for price on the following basis:

P_{\min} = Comparative price of lowest acceptable bid

5. POINTS AWARDED FOR B-BBEE STATUS LEVEL OF CONTRIBUTION

- 5.1 In terms of Regulation 5 (2) and 6 (2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded to a bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:

- 5.7 A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended sub-contractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
- 5.8 A person awarded a contract may not sub-contract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is sub-contracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
