TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

INTRODUCTION/BACKGROUND

An electrical inspection refers to the thorough checkup of the electrical connections and wiring installed in your home or business. The Electrical Inspection is by far the most complicated of the five involving not just an entire book of regulations, SANS10142-1 Electrical Installation Regulations, but also includes the occupational health and safety act, and of course these regulations change from time to time.

The old and new civic centre buildings of Sol Plaatje Municipality require a periodic inspection and testing of electrical installation. An electrical periodic inspection and testing is necessary because all electrical installations deteriorate due to a number of factors such as damage, wear and tear, corrosion, excessive electrical loading, ageing and environmental influences. Electricity can be seen as an 'invisible danger' that can cause people to have shocks, burns or even death, as well as severe damage to properties, fires and explosions.

Periodic Inspection & testing should only be carried out by an electrical competent person, such as a registered electrician.

While it may seem like a large expense for an electrical inspection, we must remember that proper inspections can protect the building from potential dangers and larger expenses in the long run. Catching a wiring issue or surge protection problem early can save enormous amounts of costs.

2. OBJECTIVE OF SPECIFICATION

The purpose of this specification is to outline the requirements for the **one-year appointment of an Electrical Contractor/Service Provider** to inspect and issue certificates of compliances for the old and new civic centre buildings of Sol Plaatje Municipality. This is a contract that is expected to last for period of **1 year** and/or to a maximum value **not exceeding R200 000.00**, whichever precedence comes first shall determine the duration of the contract.

3. SCOPE OF WORK

The successful bidder shall be required to utilize their own electrical spares and material by doing a thorough electrical inspection of the old and new buildings. The bidder must: a) find if there are any potential electrical shock, risks and/or fire hazards, b) reveal if any electrical circuits or equipment are overloaded, c) Identify defective electrical work and d) highlight any lack of earthing or bonding. In addition, tests must be carried out on wiring and fixed electrical equipment, to ensure these are also safe. The successful bidder shall adhere to applicable design, construction and safety standards and regulation during the implementation of this project.

4. REGISTRATION DETAILS

All bidders shall furnish valid certificate of registration as an **installation electrician** and member of a recognized contractor association, i.e. **Electrical Contracting Board/Electrical Contractors Association** of South Africa – ECB/ECB.

5. REQUIREMENTS FOR ISSUING OF AN ELECTRICAL CERTIFICATE OF COMPLIANCE

Only a registered person may issue a certificate of compliance accompanied by the required test report only after having satisfied himself or herself by means of an inspection and test that a new electrical installation complies with the provisions of regulation and was carried out under his or her general control; or an electrical installation which existed prior to the publication of the current edition of the health and safety standard incorporated into these Regulations. If at any time prior to the issuing of a certificate of compliance any fault or defect is detected in any part of the electrical installation, the registered person shall refuse to issue such certificate until that fault or defect has been rectified.

The onus is on the bid to draw any areas of conflict to the attention of the Municipal Representative, PRIOR TO THE CLOSING OF BIDS.

Where no NRS specification applies, SABS, IEC and other relevant international specifications shall apply to the scope of this contract.

All electrical equipment installed by users must be SANS 10142- 1 compliant, as a method of enforcing minimum safety standards. All prospective bidders and suppliers shall conform to this; any non-compliance shall be highlighted in a covering letter to the bid document.

In terms of the quality management requirement, all contractor activities and processes must comply with the relevant parts of the ISO 9000 standards or SABS 0157.

7. GUARANTEES

All equipment and materials supplied and work performed under this contract shall be guaranteed against faulty workmanship and materials for a period of 12 calendar months from the date of installation of such equipment and / or works.

8. QUALITY CONTROL

In coming goods and field works will be inspected for completeness, specification compliance, and condition on delivery. The onus is on the contractor to verify his satisfactory performance in all of these respects.

9. BID INFORMATION

The bid must include full particulars such that a proper technical evaluation can be made. Where there is a shortfall and it is necessary to call for supplementary information, no delays will be accepted that prevent completion of the adjudication.

10. OPERATING CONDITIONS

The ambient temperature conditions in Sol Plaatje Municipal area varies between –10 and + 45 degrees Celsius. There is a high dust level and the moisture content is relatively low. All equipment and materials must operate reliably under those conditions. The altitude is 1220 metres above sea level. The council network operates at 50 hertz with voltages of 66kV to 400/230V. The transformer and other system neutrals are, solidly earthed. Fault levels should not exceed 20 KA and voltage fluctuations plus and minus 10 %.

11. SOIL CONDITIONS

Bidders must please note that the soil in certain areas is very aggressive and tends to attack metallic surfaces. Equipment and material supplied must be suitably protected such that no significant corrosion results. The surface material is also generally very dry and it has a high thermal resistivity.

12. EARTHING

To ensure operator safety, earthing is at all times an important consideration and sufficient attention must be given to minimise damage to equipment as well. Where applicable; integral earthing facilities or other approved methods of earthing shall be provided by the contractor.

13. LIGHTNING PROTECTION

There is a relatively high level of lightning activity in the Sol Plaatje Municipal area which can lead to significant amount of equipment failures. The contractor must guarantee his equipment against failure due to lightning and ensure that sensitive items are protected by adequately- rated surge suppressors.

14. LABELLING

The preferred labelling convention is traffolite – type with white lettering on an orange background. Labels shall be fixed permanently in position unless loose supply is specifically requested.

15. DUST AND WATERPROOFING

All enclosures must stand up well to the wind – driven dust and heavy rains which is typical of the Northern Cape. Sealing shall be in accordance with the internationally accepted IP specifications for each application.

16. TAMPER PROOFING

All devices shall be lockable or suitably protected against tampering which may lead to hazards or unauthorised interference.

17. SABS MARK

Where applicable, the council always regards the SABS mark as a minimum standard applicable to any item supplied.

18. COMPLETE ASSEMBLIES

Where applicable, units must be supplied complete with all the subcomponents to ensure a working assembly. Any shortfall in this regard must be made by the contractor at no extra cost to the Council.

19. COMPLIANCE WITH THE OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY ACT

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Municipal Bidding Document (MBD) must form part of all bids invited.
